A big inspiration in our garden overhaul has been “companion gardening” which is a concept that pairs compatible plants together to keep away pests, aid in soil composition, enhance flavor and more. We would also like to rotate our garden, planting items consistently over the season rather than all at once. This will help yield more consistent batches of fruits and vegetables for us to share in our community.
